A few changes in my leadership team occurred over the past couple of months, and I want to make sure you all are aware of them:

Prior to Kaiser, she worked at UC Berkeley for eight years beginning as the director of Finance Planning & Budget and Contract Administration and leaving as their assistant vice chancellor & chief operating officer of Real Estate where she managed multiple strategic initiatives with the goal of improving business efficiency, cost-savings, staff right-sizing, and process simplification. Grace earned a bachelor's in business administration from CSU East Bay and a master's in business administration (MBA) from University of San Francisco.

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Grace will have a key role in expanding our e-commerce purchasing system, JAGGAER, to a unified instance, which supports UCOP's Supply Chain 500 (SC500) initiative. In order to support this effort, **Snehal Bhatt**, chief procurement officer, will report to Grace and **Hung Pham**, director of Trademarks and Strategic Contracts, will report to Snehal Bhatt. These changes leverage synergies in generating revenue and monetizing campus assets as well as managing revenue-generating service contracts and sponsorship agreements, all of which support the SC500 initiative.

Design and Construction Services is managing over \$1 billion in construction projects and will shortly embark on construction of a \$1 billion Medical Center for UCI. In order to maximize our collaboration as we move forward in these efforts, **Brian Pratt**, campus architect and assistant vice chancellor of Design and Construction Services will report to Rick Coulon, associate vice chancellor of Campus Operations. Brian will continue to serve as a DFA cabinet member.

In addition, **David Ott's** working title has changed to assistant vice chancellor of DFA Support Services, reflecting his increased portfolio. David's group is now working with and developing budgets for Enrollment Management and Athletics.

I appreciate the outstanding work and commitment of DFA. As the campus continues to rise in stature, embarking on an unprecedented building program and an aggressive \$2 billion Capital Campaign, and reaching all-time highs in research expenditures, we need to ensure we are organized to support the success of these efforts. I am confident DFA is advancing UCI's brilliant future and assisting the campus in achieving bold ideas.

UCPath - Your Pay. A New Way.

Starting in January 2020, UCI employees will get their pay a new way and go to a new online portal instead of AYSO to view pay statements, benefits, vacation, sick leave, Direct Deposit, and more.

UCPath is the University of California's new, systemwide payroll, benefits, human resources and academic personnel system. It will replace the 35-year old Payroll/Personnel System (PPS) at UCI in January 2020. Employees will go to UCPath Online via ucpath.uci.edu for 24/7 access to pay and benefits information, with convenient self-service features for employees and managers.

The Partnership for Performance (P4P) is a systemwide initiative to share custodial industry news, best practices among campuses, and promote networking opportunities. This change produced an improved work-life balance for custodial staff, and provided more opportunities to engage in campus events such as divisional town halls and staff appreciation events, as well as more personalized, and face-to-face interactions with faculty, students, and other staff members.
